Should you have any question, please do not hesitate to call the school.

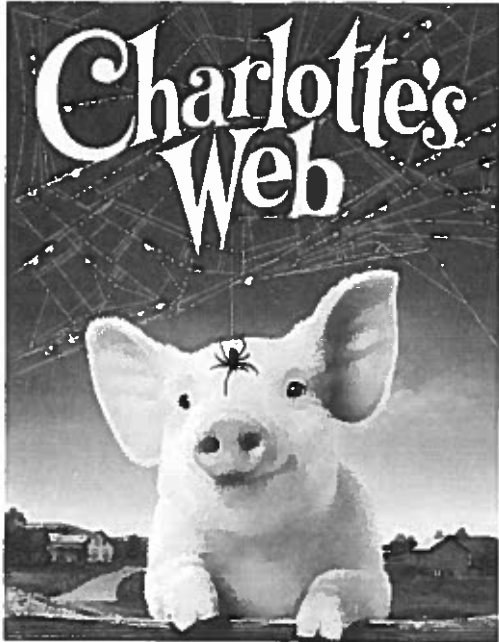

- ◆ **Headline:** A short, attention-getting statement about the article.
- ◆ **Byline:** Author of the article.
- ◆ **Lead paragraph:** Who, what, when, where, why, and how about the article.
- ◆ **Explanation paragraphs:** More facts or details (may also include direct quotes from witnesses or bystanders).

Some newspaper articles include a photo with a caption.

DIRECTIONS: Choose **ONE** of the enclosed “newspapers” to write a newspaper article based on the Charlotte’s Web photo. Your article should be relevant to the photo. Remember to write a catchy headline above each article and a descriptive caption under the photo.
